Nomination Fees:

Entry to all Events \$100, Pistol Events Only - \$50, Rifle Events Only - \$70. Juniors half price.

Event nominations include sausage sizzle each day.

Nominations to be received by Sunday, 13th September, 2026.

Competitors can nominate and pay online via the SSAA Mudgee Squadspot events page.

Payment by EFTPOS/cash on the day also available.

Current SSAA and Grading cards must be produced at Registration.

No grading card is automatic entry to the highest grade with 3 competitors.

Camping and Caravans permitted at the Range from Thursday to Monday, Male and Female toilets and hot showers located at Range 2.

Scoring and conduct of events:

It is planned to conduct a major component of the titles utilizing electronic targetry. In the event that a shot has not been recorded by an electronic acoustic target, the competitor may be permitted to reshoot the unrecorded shot at the discretion of the Head Scorer.

The competitor will be given realisable time for each unrecorded round of the relay.

Where electronic acoustic targets are being used for scoring, the intended electronic target system for centrefire rifles at the Championships will be the Shotmarker system. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure their rifle and ammunition combination has the required velocity to register on the target. This can be checked on practice day and if the rounds do not register then a manual target will be available. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that they attend the Championships with sufficient ammunition to deal with this eventuality. Events may be re-scheduled at the discretion of the Organisers to deal with changing circumstances such as inclement weather, etc.
